Rules

Please save this file as it contains vital information and a route map.

- Do NOT leave your vehicle. Please use the bathroom before you leave for your drive. Should you get stuck during your drive, please attempt to make contact with us at the number below. Should you not have cell phone coverage, we will notice your vehicle has not moved in more than 30 minutes, and we will come to assist. Remain in your vehicle at all times.
- Do NOT make fires or pitstops in the reserve. We are in a high-risk fire area.
- Do NOT tamper with the GPS tracker placed in your car. Any tampering or removing the tracker from the vehicle will result in the deposit being retained.
- Do NOT leave the road to get closer to animals, and give the animals their space. Please keep in mind these are wild animals, and might react aggressively when you get too close.
- Do NOT litter.
- Do NOT feed the wildlife or attempt to do so.
- Do NOT play loud music when driving in the reserve as this may spoil the experience for other guests.
- When visiting the viewing deck and watering hole, please keep your voice down as to not spook the wildlife at the watering hole.
- DO have fun, and enjoy the African bush at its best.

Facts

- The reserve covers and area of about 30 000 hectares, including shrubland, riverine forests, and mountains.
- The main river flowing through the reserve is called the Omaruru River. It is non-perennial and only flows after heavy rainfall in the Erongo mountains.
- We have a large variety of wildlife in the reserve of about 200 species of mammals, and 90 species of birds.
- The main purpose of the reserve is to provide a save haven to all wildlife, and to act as a second chance for animals deemed "problem animals" in other parts of the country.
